This request for applications is open to Texas state institutions of higher education only and funds project for up to two years. The GLO R&D program was established through the Oil Spill Prevention and Response Act (OSPRA), Chapter 40 of the Texas Natural Resources Code, which designated the GLO to serve as the lead state agency in preventing and responding to coastal and marine oil spills. The GLO is accepting applications for projects that provide research, testing, and development of oil discharge prevention and response technology, oil discharge response training, wildlife and natural resources rescue and rehabilitation, development of computer models to predict the movements and impacts of unauthorized discharges of oil, and other purposes consistent with and in furtherance of the OSPRA. The cycle will fund projects beginning September 1, 2022. The call for proposals is an approximately 30 day notice.
