AIDA IV (Egypt)

Port Said, Jun 4 -- Training *Aida IV* completed repairs and sailed on Jun 3. -- Lloyd's Agents. (See issue of May 28.)

ASPHALT SEMINOLE (Republic of Ireland)

London, Jun 4 -- A US Coast Guard press report, dated Jun 3, states: The Coast Guard responded to an asphalt spill at the Sprague Energy terminal on the Fore River, Maine, around 1930, local time, Jun 2. Tanker (unspecified) *Asphalt Seminole* (6292 gt, built 2005) notified Coast Guard Sector Northern New England at 1900, that about 670 gallons of asphalt was released into the river while they were transferring product to the terminal. Once in contact with the cold water, the hot asphalt solidified and formed a pancake-like material within the containment boom that was already in place around the vessel and pier, as required during transfers. The sector dispatched a pollution investigator, a marine investigator and a facility responder. Additionally, the South Portland Fire Department, Maine Department of Environmental Protection, National Response Corporation and Sprague's terminal manager responded. Sprague contracted Clean Harbors Environmental Services to clean up the spill. "The Coast Guard is currently investigating the cause of the spill," said Cmdr. Brian Downey, the deputy sector commander of Coast Guard Sector Northern New England. "Every effort is being made to ensure a swift clean-up with minimal impact to the environment".

BORDER (Antigua & Barbuda)

London, Jun 4 -- Fully cellular containership *Border* arrived Beira May 27, sailed May 29 and arrived Durban Jun 2 and according to Lloyd's MIU AIS was still at Durban at 0117, UTC, today. (See issue of May 26.)

DAWN PRINCESS (U.K.)

London, Jun 3 -- A press report, dated today, states: Swine flu fears disrupted another Australian cruise yesterday when New Caledonia authorities refused to allow passengers ashore because some had flu symptoms, an official said. Meanwhile, other Asian countries reported that the virus was continuing to spread. Passenger (cruise) *Dawn Princess* (77441 gt, built 1997) with almost 2,000 passengers on board is on a 13-day South Pacific cruise. New Caledonia was to be the final destination before the vessel returns to Sydney on Friday (Jun 5). But authorities refused the ship permission to let passengers disembark on Lifou Island after the crew reported four or five had flu symptoms, cruise ship owner Carnival PLC spokesman Anthony Fisk said. Two Carnival cruises from Sydney to the South Pacific and to Australia's Great

Barrier Reef have reported cases of swine flu in recent weeks. Fisk said Carnival regularly sails through New Caledonia. The ship had already visited Fiji and Vanuatu. Swabs from the sick passengers will be flown from New Caledonia to Sydney, where they will be tested for swine flu before the *Dawn Princess* returns, Fisk said.

London, Jun 4 -- A press report, dated today, states: Passenger (cruise) *Dawn Princess* has been cleared of swine flu two days after it was turned away from New Caledonia. NSW's chief health officer Kerry Chant, said swabs taken from five passengers yesterday returned negative results for the H1N1 virus. "This means that all 2000 passengers and 800 crew will be allowed to disembark the ship on Friday morning (Jun 5) and continue their onward travel, as normal," Dr Chant said. The *Dawn Princess's* 13-day South Pacific journey was plagued with hiccups. The vessel left Sydney nine hours late on May 24 after two passengers on the previous cruise required testing for swine flu. It was forced to abandon its first scheduled stop on Noumea, in New Caledonia, because of bad weather. And after four stops in Fiji and Vanuatu, New Caledonian authorities refused to allow the *Dawn Princess* to dock for its final stop on Tuesday morning after the vessel's crew notified them of five passengers with flu-like symptoms. Dr Chant last night said there were still no confirmed cases of community transmitted swine flu in NSW. "Despite the fact that Victoria has raised its alert level to "sustain", NSW will continue to apply containment measures," she said.

FORTUNA REEFER (Kiribati)

London, Jun 4 -- Reefer *Fortuna Reefer* arrived Busan May 28 from Shidao, and sailed same day for Pohnpei. (See issue of Mar 5.)

GAN-VENTURE (Bahamas)

London, Jun 4 -- Combined chemical and oil tanker *Gan-Venture* arrived Vancouver 1305, Jun 1 and according to Lloyd's MIU AIS was in lat 48 50N, long 123 03W, at 0304, UTC, today, course 127 degrees, speed 15.4 knots. (See issue of Jun 4.)

GREAT NEWS (Liberia)

London, Jun 3 -- A press report, dated today, states: Energy Minister James Robertson, Ministry officials and the media got a close up view of damage done to one of the loading docks at the Petrojam refinery off Marcus Garvey Drive in Kingston this morning. On Monday, crude oil tanker *Great News* transporting crude oil struck the dock significantly damaging the huge concrete structure. The ship too had a large gash in its side,

showing the impact of the contact. Despite the damage, the Energy Minister said the dock will still be used to collect crude oil from incoming vessels. "We are looking at converting the damaged dock into a single point mooring system, really just using the existing structure to continue the operation of Petrojam, the offloading of fuel. We're also exploring the usage of other company storage and that will help us along the south coast with Jamaica Public Service Company and with the mining industry," said Mr. Robertson. He added that a probe into what led to the accident is now being carried out. He was however unable to give a date for completion of the investigation. According to Mr. Robertson, the impact site and the equipment lost during the accident were insured and the ship in question will have to stay in the country longer than planned as there is still crude oil to be offloaded from it. However, because of the accident, the owners of the vessel will have to continue to pay berthing costs. (See issue of Jun 4.)

KIZHUCH (Russia)

Moscow, Jun 3 -- Tanker (unspecified) *Kizhuch* refloated 1320, local time, Jun 2, with tug assistance after partial off-loading to another tanker. No spill reported. -- Correspondent. (See issue of Jun 4.)

LYSINGEN (Norway)

Sandnes, Jun 3 -- Roll On Roll Off *Lysingen* (2490 gt, built 1992) grounded on rocks when arriving Vennesund from Holm at 1830, local time, today. At 2100, local time, rescue vessel *Harald V* arrived and 30 minutes later the ferry was refloated on high tide and moored to quay at Vennesund. The ferry has damaged her propeller and will need repair. Other ferries in the company will serve the Holm-Vennesund route from tomorrow. -- Correspondent.

MASTRO GIORGIS II (Cyprus)

Chittagong, Jun 4 -- The situation of lighter vessel *Titu-9* remains unchanged. Bulk carrier *Mastro Giorgis II* was released on May 31 and sailed at 1500, Jun 2. -- Lloyd's Agents. (See issue of May 29.)

MATANUSKA (U.S.A.)

London, Jun 4 -- A State of Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities, press release, dated May 29, states: The Alaska Marine Highway System (AMHS) passenger ro/ro *Matanuska's* (3029 gt, built 1963) return to service has been delayed at a Portland, Ore, shipyard following a generator failure onboard the vessel. According to Capt. John Falvey, AMHS general manager, the ship's return has been delayed until Jun 20 when it sails northbound from Ketchikan. *Matanuska* was previously scheduled to return to service Jun 2. "During this winter's federal overhaul, we reconditioned and overhauled the ships' three generators," Falvey said. "When the generators were started up,
